I have three children in Garderie Aimee, all three of which started when they were 20 weeks old (when my maternity leave ended). My eldest child started with Garderie Aimee in 2005. The daycare has provided excellent care both in terms of educational progress, where my eldest son has been able to count to 20 in both French and English for over a year (he will be 4 in May), he can write his name and his numbers as well as many other activities. I have been impressed with both the nurturing nature of the staff, particularly with the children when they were/are babies and the educational aspects when they are older.

Garderie Aimee has scheduled trips allowing the children to go to the Cabane à Sucre and other such activities exposing the children to a wide variety of experiences. There is a clear schedule with the daily activities, both physical and intellectual, for the babies and older children. These schedules are outlined on a board outside each classroom, so it is easy for parents to follow what the children are doing. The staff is always helpful in terms of giving information to parents about what type of day the children had and if there were any particular issues that we should be aware of- even giving us details as to such things as your child missing his nap.

I am an educator by profession albeit I teach PhD and MSc students. The curriculum is obviously vastly different, but I still can appreciate the basic pedagogical principles being used and can see that the Garderie Aimee staff are achieving their educational goals.

I feel extremely lucky that Garderie Aimee had space to enroll our children.
